Bread for the World Update

Before, during, and after worship last Sunday we wrote 56 letters to our Representatives and Senators urging their support of H. Res. 189 in the House and support for increasing U.S. funding of global nutrition programs to \$250 million in the 2020 appropriations bill. If you were away for Father's Day and still want to participate, you may write or type letters at home and bring them to church on June 23. We just learned that Rep. Susan Brooks has become a co-sponsor of H. Res. 189, so be sure to thank her for her support of that but urge her support of the \$250 million for global nutrition. Founded in 1987, the Damien Center is the oldest and largest organization in Indiana addressing the health needs of individuals with HIV. Currently the Damien Center serves over 4,000 individuals affected by HIV/AIDS through a comprehensive and innovative approach to HIV care and prevention.

Even though we hear of the many achievements in medications used to treat HIV here are a couple statistics to keep in mind. In the general population, 1 out of every 6 persons infected with HIV does not know it. 51% of youth between 13 – 24 who are living with HIV, have never been tested. Let's help keep HIV testing and education accessible to Central Indiana through our support of the Damien Center.
