Today's Scripture (Inclusive Bible Translation)

Genesis 32:22-31

²² In the course of the night, Jacob arose, took the entire caravan, and crossed the ford of the Yabbok River. ²³ After Jacob had crossed with all his possessions, he returned to the camp, ²⁴ and he was completely alone. And there, someone wrestled with Jacob until the first light of dawn. ²⁵ Seeing that Jacob could not be overpowered, the other struck Jacob at the socket of the hip, and the hip was dislocated as they wrestled. ²⁶ Then Jacob's contender said, "Let me go, for day is breaking." Jacob answered, "I will not let you go until you bless me." ²⁷ "What is your name?" the other asked. "Jacob," he answered. 28 The other said, "Your name will no longer be called 'Jacob,' or 'Heel-Grabber,' but 'Israel'—'Overcomer of God'—because you have wrestled with both God and mortals, and you have prevailed." ²⁹ Then Jacob asked "Now tell me your name, I beg you." The other said, "Why do you ask me my name?"—and blessed Jacob there. 30 Jacob named the place Peniel—"Face of God"—"because I have seen God face to face, yet my life was spared." ³¹ At sunrise, Jacob left Peniel, limping along from the injured hip.
