Genesis 4:3-9

³ In the course of time Cain brought an offering to YHWH from the fruit of the soil, ⁴ while Abel, for his part, brought one of the finest of the firstborn of his flock. YHWH looked with favor on Abel's offering, ⁵ but had no regard for Cain's offering. At this, Cain was filled with rage and despair. ⁶ YHWH asked Cain, "Why are you filled with rage? Why are you downcast? ⁷ If you intend good, you can hold up your head; if you don't intend good, then sin is a demon haunting your doorway, and it wants you—but you can conquer it." ⁸ Cain said to Abel, "Let us go out in the field." When they were in the field, Cain turned on his brother Abel and killed him. ⁹ God asked Cain, "Where is Abel your brother?" Cain answered, "I don't know. Am I my brother's keeper?"
