# **Today's Scripture (Inclusive Translation)**

# Colossians 1:11-20

<sup>11</sup> By the might of God's glory you'll be endowed with the strength needed to stand fast and endure joyfully whatever may happen. 12 Thanks be to God for having made you worthy to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light! <sup>13</sup> God rescued us from the authority of darkness and brought us into the reign of Jesus, God's only begotten. <sup>14</sup> and it is through Jesus that we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. <sup>15</sup> Christ is the image of the unseen God and the firstborn of all creation, <sup>16</sup> for in Christ were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and invisible, thrones, dominations, sovereignties, Powers—all things were created through Christ and for Christ. <sup>17</sup> Before anything was created, Christ existed, and all things hold together in Christ. <sup>18</sup> The church is the body: Christ is its head. Christ is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, and so Christ is first in every way. <sup>19</sup> God wanted all perfection to be found in Christ, <sup>20</sup> and all things to be reconciled to God through Christ—everything in heaven and everything on earth—when Christ made peace by dving on the cross.
