Rev. Ayanna L. Garrett is a spirit-filled preacher and teacher of the gospel of Jesus Christ. She is a native of Bellwood, Illinois and grew up at First Christian Church (DOC) of Maywood, IL. She attended the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign where she earned a BS in Communications and a Master of Science in Counseling at Eastern Illinois University. Soon after graduation from EIU, Rev. Garrett was hired at Ball State University where she directed the College and Career Counseling Center at the Indiana Academy for Science, Mathematics, and Humanities for ten years. During her time in Muncie, Rev. Garrett was very active in her church and in the community where she began a mentoring program within the city for young girls. Rev. Garrett received her call to ministry while in Muncie and was licensed to preach soon after.

In 2006, Rev. Garrett moved to Indianapolis to pursue a Master of Divinity at Christian

Theological Seminary (CTS). While in in seminary she taught dance at First Congregational United Church of Christ in Indianapolis for the New Creation Service, a service dedicated to the worship of God through the arts. Rev. Garrett graduated from CTS in 2010 and was ordained into the Christian ministry.

Rev. Garrett has a heart for seeing the sacred expressed and experienced through the arts. She skillfully incorporates the arts into her lectures, workshops, teaching and preaching. She has been dancing since the age of three and has been trained in ballet, modern, African and tap dance. Rev. Garrett is a highly sought-after speaker and has spoken at church related and secular workshops and conferences throughout the United States, Germany and Nicaragua. She currently resides in Bolingbrook, Illinois. She fulfills her call to walk with students as they discern their call to ministry as the Associate Director of Recruitment at Chicago Theological Seminary.

November Mission of the Month: Family Promise

This month our Mission of the Month is Family Promise of Greater Indianapolis, the organization that serves families in crisis by providing short term housing while helping them to find permanent housing and providing skills that will help clients keep jobs and manage finances. FCC has been affiliated with Family Promise, formerly known as Interfaith Hospitality Network, for over 25 years. As our congregation's make-up and size have changed in recent years, the Council has approved a recommendation from Outreach & Service for us to discontinue hosting families at our church but to continue as a "supporting congregation." This means providing monetary support, taking part in the clothing drives, providing school clothing for the children in the After Care program through our "Underneath It All" drives, and providing Christmas gifts from the gift cards on our "Giving Tree." Our monetary support helps with maintaining the day center and services for clients, including providing bus passes and gas cards. Since we are no longer hosting, our monetary support is even more important now. Please give generously to support the important service Family Promise provides to homeless families in our city.
