A Chance to Offer International Help

Shannon Abbott, Cassidy Hall and Sandy Wood will be going to the U.S. Mexico border January 14th with a group from the Indiana-Kentucky Conference of the UCC to witness what is happening there. Outreach and Service Board is making 25 **hygiene kits** for our host congregation, Good Shepherd UCC in Tucson, AZ. to use in their work with migrant shelters there and in Mexico.

The Board is providing most of the items for the kits, but has asked the congregation's help in obtaining hand towels and white adult size tube socks. The tree in the Parlor which had gift cards for Family Promise will now contain ornaments specifying an amount of socks or towels to buy. Please take an ornament, buy the item(s) on the ornament, and return the item(s) and ornament to the tree by Sunday Jan 5th. On Sunday January 5th we will assemble the kits after worship.
