## Today's Scripture

### Luke 9:1-6 (Inclusive Bible)

<sup>1</sup> Jesus called the twelve together and gave them power and authority to overcome all demons and to cure diseases. <sup>2</sup> He sent them forth to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the afflicted. <sup>3</sup> Jesus told them, "take nothing for the journey, neither walking staff, nor travelling bag, nor bread, nor money. Don't even take a change of clothes. <sup>4</sup> Stay at whatever house you enter, and proceed from there. <sup>5</sup> As for those who don't receive you, leave that town and shake its dust from your feet as a testimony against them." <sup>6</sup> So they set out and went from village to village, spreading the Good news everywhere and healing people.
