November 22: In 1970 at the 350th commemoration of the Mayflower landing at Plymouth, a Wampanoag leader named Wamsutta (Frank B.) James was invited to speak at the state dinner. Wamsutta accepted, and wrote a speech explaining how to the native peoples, the Thanksgiving holiday is a day of mourning. The planners asked to review his speech prior to the event, and they determined it was not appropriate. They asked Wamsutta to change it. He refused, and his invitation to speak was withdrawn. racial justice - what can we do together that will help us move forward - ourselves, each other, our community and the bigger systems. There are many paths we can follow, including more education, advocacy, partnering, and other actions. Bring you ideas!

While there are many many noteworthy quotes in this book, I think this one is worth repeating in preparation for our discussion on Sunday: "Reconciliation is not about white feelings. It's about diverting power and attention to the oppressed, toward the powerless. It's not enough to dabble at diversity and inclusion while leaving the existing authority structure in place. Reconciliation demands more."
