# **Dear First Congregational,**

I give God thanks for each one of you, for our faith community at First Congregational, and for the creative and meaningful ways we come together to Be The Church. As part of the United Church of Christ, we join together with our wider church family to pray this special Thanksgiving Day Prayer:

#### FC Covid Protocols:
