Update on "Days for Girls" Project



The IN-KY Conference and Outreach & Service project for putting together 100 menstrual hygiene kits for girls in developing countries is well under way. The response has been gratifying. Cutters are preparing fabric, sewers are sewing shields, pads and drawstring bags, and suppliers have been shopping or checking their own stashes. We would welcome more cutters and sewers. **We now have enough Ziploc freezer bags and travel-size soaps thanks to some generous donations!** 120 pairs of panties are on order with donated funds. We still need 22 more pairs or money to buy them. **We have**

received a tew sets that are not 100% cotton which we cannot use. If you donated Felina or Calvin Klein brands of this type, please see if you can exchange them. We need 100% cotton, dark but pretty colors, and no bikinis or boy cuts. We expect to receive more fabric donations soon but still may need to purchase some more, likely flannel. So we are still accepting monetary donations designated for "Days for Girls." We also need 50 more wash cloths (good quality, regular size in dark, but pretty colors, also 100% cotton). Kohl's and Target are good sources for those. We'll keep you posted on the progress of the project, and thanks for your support. I will have cut fabric sets for shields to hand off to sewers each Sunday and also prepared flannel. Contact Sue Chapman for ways you can get involved!
