Minister's Message

Dear First Congregational Church Family,

On Sunday we heard the Apostle Paul's words about speaking the truth in love. Churches can learn from the theory of Non-Violent Communication, developed by Marshall B. Rosenberg, Ph.D. as presented in his book, <u>Nonviolent Communication: A Language of Life.</u>

Here is a recap of my adaptation for us to consider:

1. Observation that God is in the Moment: As Paul says, we are to lead a life worthy of the calling to which we are called as followers of the way of Jesus. This means humility, gentleness, patience bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

So we begin with observing in a spirit of humility, gentleness and patience, we notice what is around us without judging, without labeling good or bad. We notice simply what is there in the present moment. We observe that God is also present in this moment. This is taking time to observe before we speak.

2. Feeling Unity in the Spirit: Paul says, there is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Creator of all, who is above all, and through all and in all.

Take a moment to notice what you are feeling, what are the various emotions and physical sensations. Feeling is different than thinking. This is a time to feel God's Spirit, to feel the oneness with the body of Christ, to feel God's presence and to feel whatever else is going on emotionally and physically. Before we speak, we check in with our spirits, our emotions, our body. We connect ourselves in unity with the Spirit that makes us one.

3. Noticing the Needs of the Body of Christ: Paul says, each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. We each are in need of grace, grace from God and grace from one another. Everyone needs and deserves God's grace.

Taking a moment before we speak, we honor that everyone has need for grace.

Understanding this need will help us to cultivate empathy so that we can speak the truth in love.

4. Speaking the truth in Love: Paul says, speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into Christ, from whom the whole body is joined and knit together, promoting the body's growth in building itself up in love.

The fourth and last step to remember when we seek to speak the truth in love is to ground our words in God's love. This means that what we say is true because it honors who we are as children of God, it honors who others are as children of God. What we say is loving and true because it build us up in love, it does not tear us down and it is not hateful.

Speaking the truth in love means that what we say is a request for action that is realistic and positive, that is concrete and immediate. Speaking from a place of truth and love is what Christ calls us to do.

We speak the truth in love by (1) making the observation that God is present in this moment (2) Feeling unity in the Spirit (3) Noticing the Needs of the Body of Christ (4) Speaking the truth in Love.

This is something we can use in our daily lives with our partners, friends, family, at work, at church, at community meetings...anytime we find ourselves desiring to as Paul says, "lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility, gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

O God of the Christ-Child, whose own earthly parents were forced to flee the statesanctioned violence of Herod, and find safety in a foreign nation,

Give us hearts like the people of Egypt to offer not only refuge but welcome to those who arrive at our doorstep in need of safety and protection.

O God who calls us to offer welcome to the stranger, just as we would offer it to Christ,

Remind us today and every day that we need not fear what we do not know, but are freed by following your Gospel call to welcome.

O God of all people, of all nations and of all the earth, protect this day those in need of safety, put a salve on the souls of those grieving the loss of home, family, loved ones and memories.

Give us the conviction to offer welcome, safety, Christian love and a space for new beginnings to refugees and asylum-seekers. Instill in our hearts the courage to love as Jesus taught us, in a world that encourages suspicion, fear and scarcity.

O God of all sojourners in search of refuge, We ask you to create peace in this world so that none of your children live in places endangered by violence and civil unrest. We ask for comfort for all who have been forced to flee their homes, and we ask that those in need of peace and protection find both refuge and welcome. We give you thanks this day for refugees and asylumseekers in our midst, and for the blessings they bring to our families, churches, communities and nation. Amen.

Chronic housing-related illnesses decrease. 71% of homeowners started, completed, or plan to complete higher education or professional training. Homeowners end or reduce their dependence on public assistance programs like Public Housing Assistance, Utility Bill/Energy Assistance, Supplemental Nutritional Assistance (SNAP), Temporary Aid for Needy Families (TANF), and aid to Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).
