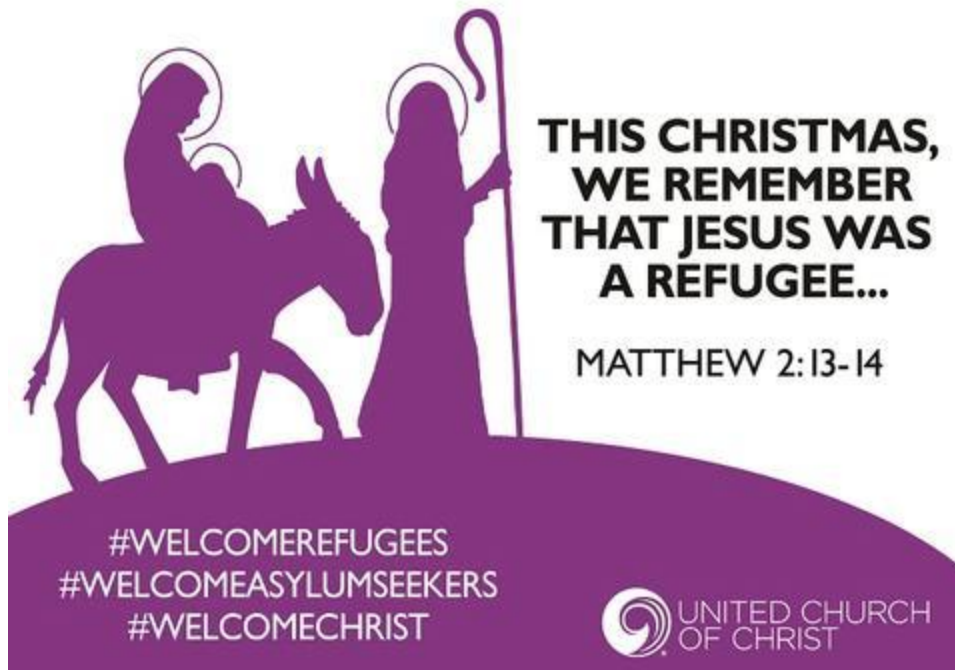

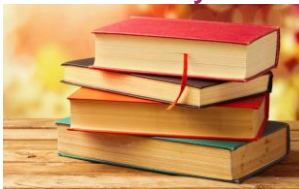


Flowers Needed

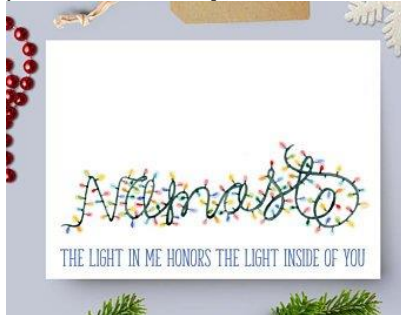
The Giving Tree

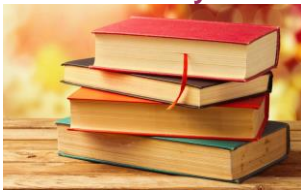

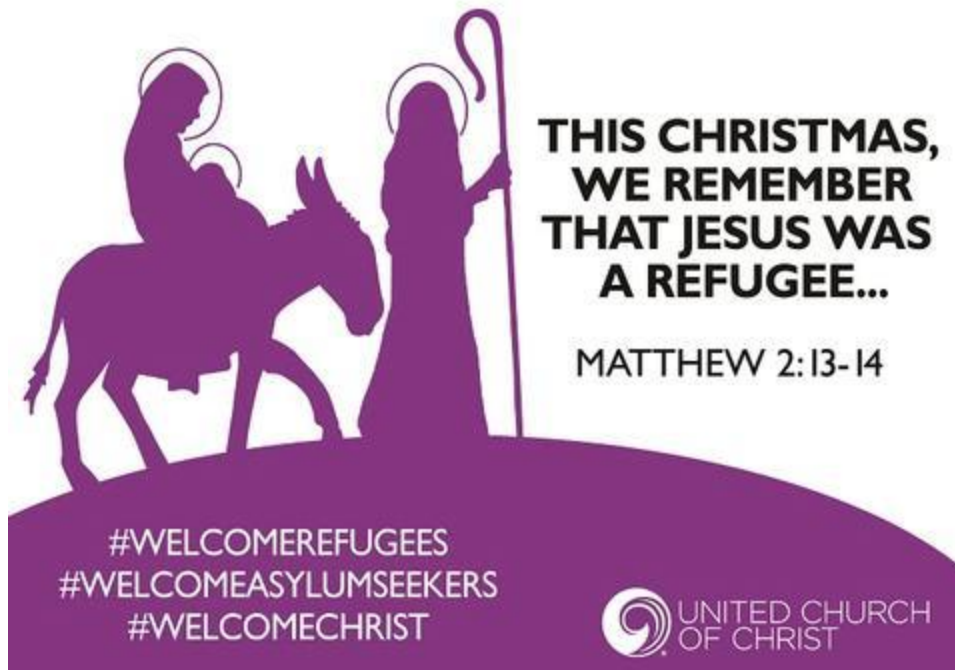

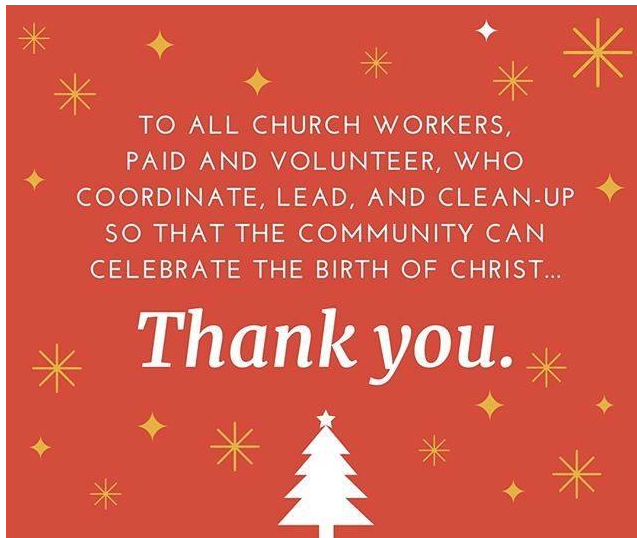
