FCC Solar Project!!!

The First Congregational Green Team is pleased to announce the start of a fund drive to install solar panels. Solar power is clean, renewable and affordable. We've calculated that solar panels would pay back our initial investment at an annual rate of roughly 8% by reducing our church's electrical bills (based on current power consumption). It's not often that doing the right thing for the planet aligns so neatly with doing the right thing for our wallets, so it makes abundant sense for us to take this step.

We're planning to raise \$60,000 by September 1st. To give this effort a boost, Rich Gibson has pledged to match all contributions, dollar for dollar, up to \$20,000. Our tenant, the Meridian Hills Cooperative Preschool and Kindergarten, is collecting pennies from all the children to pitch into this effort.

Dear First Congregational Family,

One of the beautiful aspects of our life together is that God has invited us to partner in exploring ways we can help bring hope to people in need of healing, specifically as relates to mental health. I am thankful that God calls us to share our gifts with each other, even if these gifts are a result of suffering and hardship. I have learned a lot from difficult times in my life. These challenges shape who I am and how I am called to serve the church as a minister and mental health educator.

This Sunday I am serving the wider church's mental health ministry as a guest of Kirk in the Hills Presbyterian Church in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan. This invitation came last year when they were planning a series of Sundays to raise awareness and educate members about mental health. After reading my book Blessed Are The Crazy: Breaking the Silence About Mental Illness, Family and Church, they invited me to come to help the church learn ways they can help be welcoming, inclusive, supportive, and engaged with people who

Is FCC a Just Peace Church?

Becoming a Just Peace Church will be the focus of the Adult Education classes for the five Sundays in July. Truth is, FCC has in the past and is already now doing many things that promote peace and justice. But we have not yet taken the formal step of writing a Just Peace Church covenant and declaring ourselves to be a Just Peace Church via a congregational vote. FCC - which often takes a lead in UCC initiatives - is a little behind. According to a list from http://www.ucc.org/just_peace_churches, there are at least 162 UCC churches that have declared themselves to be a Just Peace Church. Four of those churches are in the Indiana-Kentucky conference:

- 1. First United, Rising Sun, IN
- 2. Zion UCC, Henderson, KY

- 3. Shalom UCC, Lafayette, IN
- 4. Zion UCC, South Bend, IN

Isn't it time that we joined them? Not so fast - there is a process and a time of discernment (though I'm liking your enthusiasm!). For the past several months the Adult Education class has been exploring the interrelated topics of peace, nonviolence, Shalom, and justice. All of that study and discussion has been good preparation for beginning to look in earnest about becoming a Just Peace Church. For five Sundays in July, we will look at the process and what other churches have done.Come join us!

Minister's Message

Dear First Congregational Family,

"Who will be the next one hundred people to join our congregation? Why will they join our church rather than some other congregation? After they join, how active will these new members be in the life, program, fellowship, ministry and witness of this congregation? How long will it take our congregation to receive one hundred new members? A year? A month? A decade?" From an article titled, "Membership Recruitment," The Parish Paper, Yokefellow Institute, May 1974.

Wow. This is the opening paragraph of an article in old newsletter I discovered while going through a box of donated materials and the newsletter is dated May of 1974. While a lot has changed about American society and the trends of church membership, what has not changed is the desire for congregations like ours to grow. We want to grow both in deepening our faithfulness and in our impact in making the world a more just and loving place. We would like for more people to know about our mission, to get involved, to join us

and to grow with us.

How do churches grow? According to this newsletter, the key to growth is "to build new and strengthen existing friendship lines between members of your congregation and persons who are not actively involved in the life of any worshipping congregation. Studies of rapidly growing congregations reveal that most new members had at least one friend or relative in that congregation who opened the door to membership. While it is difficult to increase the number of kinship ties, the number of friendship ties can be increased by systemic, persistent and intentional efforts to increase face-to-face contacts and to focus on the other person's need."

I think this focus on membership growth through friendships is worth giving some additional thought. While many of our first time visitors report discovering our church through our website or our Facebook page, we know that people looking for a church home are looking for connection. I like this idea of keeping in mind the people we know and intentionally "opening the door" for people to experience worship at First Congregational UCC. As we look towards the future, we know that we want to grow with new members. How long will it take for us to get 100 new members? I'm not sure the answer to that question. But I do know that it is important for all of us to reach out to others, invite them to church, and help us to grow as the body of Christ.

Mission of the Month, Underneath it all

This mission provides underwear and school uniforms for children in IHN/Family Promise Aftercare. This helps families getting back on their feet stretch their budget through having fewer school clothes to purchase. You can help by doing any of the following:

- Buy underwear/socks/shirts/pantsin any size from child size 4 to adult boys or girls. Put in the white laundry baskets in Narthex during July. Sports bras & small size boys & girls underpants are particularly desired.
- 2. **Donate new or gently used pants, shirts, skirts, or jumpers**-all sizes from child size 4 to adult. Shirts must be collared in any solid color, without decoration or logo. Pants, skirts, or jumpers must be a solid color (tan, navy or black) with no decoration.
- 3. **Donate \$ in July to buy uniforms or underwear in-** change, dollar bills and checks designated **Underneath It All** in the memo line will help. We will buy clothes with the money donated.

I know it seems early, but school starts again Aug 1st for many schools, so new uniforms will be needed soon. The Aftercare Program of the Family Promise/IHN program helps those who get housing remain housed. Our past donations have provided each child in the Aftercare Program at least 1 full new uniform including underwear and socks. This is very much appreciated by the families and by Family Promise, so please continue to be generous.
