



Mission of the Month, Exodus Refugee

Despite significant cuts to the US immigration program by the present administration, refugees are still arriving in Indianapolis to make their new homes. Exodus Refugee Immigration is a local, independent, nonsectarian, not-for-profit 501 C3 organization that resettles legally admitted refugees who have experienced persecution in their home

countries and are unable to return. Since 1981 Exodus has been welcoming thoroughly vetted refugees and helping them achieve self-sufficiency in their new homes in our community. Exodus is still serving new arrivals, arriving from Burma (now including Rohingya), Congo, and Syria, and those already here with a variety of programs designed to help them achieve self-sufficiency. Exodus not only meets the basic needs of these newcomers but provides a full array of services including social and medical services, English language training, cultural orientation, and employment services, all of which help these new members of the community settle in and thrive.
