Our Neighbors in Need offering for October gives us as members of UCC the opportunity to have a greater outreach. As a new member of your outreach and services board that gives me joy. Dear First Congregational,

Council Resolution on Inclusive Language in Worship

The Council recently passed the following resolution:

"First Congregational UCC shall encourage inclusive language in worship whenever appropriate."

We came to this decision with some measure of enthusiasm: God is Spirit, and those that worship God must do so in spirit and in faith...which means, as Spirit, God has no gender. To refer to God as He/Him/His inherently limits our conception of God. To remove gender from our conception of God is not "politically correct," but spiritually correct. This improvement to our conception of God cannot be complete in one fell swoop; old habits are deeply ingrained. We don't have the final word in stone as to how we will implement this, but we're going to start small and move forward in a deliberate and intelligent way. For now, you should start seeing and hearing the removal of gendered pronouns when referring to God in the spoken and printed scriptural readings during Sunday services. The Inclusive Bible shall be a primary reference as we work our way through this. To expand on this point: the UCC does not have an official or authorized translation of the Bible. We use the NRSV a lot, but not exclusively. Future readings are likely to be wholly NRSV sometimes, wholly King James occasionally, NRSV with changes inspired by the Inclusive Bible, wholly taken from the Inclusive Bible, or something else. Each week, Pastor Sarah and that week's worship leader will work together to develop a reading that meets the intent of the Council's resolution.

For example,

- "God" and "God's" will be used instead of "He," "Him," and "His."
- "Loving Parent," "Sacred Presence," or "Divine Creator" instead of "Father"
- "Lord" may just disappear

This is not an exhaustive list, but a place to start. If you have comments or suggestions, we'd love to hear from you!



Epistle for the Week of October 31, 2019



Dear First Congregational,

On Sunday, October 27, I joined Pastor Chip Jahn at St. Peter UCC in Lamar, Indiana, for their Missionfest lifting up mental health ministry. It was a joyful time together celebrating the outreach ministries of the congregation and listening together to the ways that mental health ministry can be included in their efforts to care for each other and the community. I

met the young man (now a high school senior) who as a young boy on a mission trip to Chicago for the first time saw a person living on the streets and upon returning to church Sunday morning announced that the church needed to end homelessness. Today he plans to go to medical school and after my sermon he shared he wants to be a neuro scientist to help treat mental health challenges. The youth of the church are a small but mighty group of visionary leaders.

I bring you warm greetings from our sister church and celebrate the power of our collective witness to justice and peace in the world. As you know, Chip is a national leader in the UCC Just Peace movement. It's exciting to think about how mental health justice can be part of the Just Peace movement. I invite you to dream, to wonder, and to explore this with me.

This is such important and exciting work we are doing together. I remain deeply thankful to First Congregational for being partners with me on the journey.

I count it a great blessing of joy to serve as your pastor. I look forward to being with you all on Sunday, November 10th when we will be welcoming new members to the congregation.

Council Resolution on Inclusive Language in Worship

The Council recently passed the following resolution:

"First Congregational UCC shall encourage inclusive language in worship whenever appropriate."

We came to this decision with some measure of enthusiasm: God is Spirit, and those that worship God must do so in spirit and in faith...which means, as Spirit, God has no gender. To refer to God as He/Him/His inherently limits our conception of God. To remove gender from our conception of God is not "politically correct," but spiritually correct. This improvement to our conception of God cannot be complete in one fell swoop; old

nabits are deeply ingrained. We don't have the final word in stone as to how we will implement this, but we're going to start small and move forward in a deliberate and intelligent way. For now, you should start seeing and hearing the removal of gendered pronouns when referring to God in the spoken and printed scriptural readings during Sunday services. The Inclusive Bible shall be a primary reference as we work our way through this. To expand on this point: the UCC does not have an official or authorized translation of the Bible. This month our Mission of the Month is Family Promise of Greater Indianapolis, the organization that serves families in crisis by providing short term housing while helping them to find permanent housing and providing skills that will help clients keep jobs and manage finances. FCC has been affiliated with Family Promise, formerly known as Interfaith Hospitality Network, for over 25 years. As our congregation's make-up and size have changed in recent years, the Council has approved a recommendation from Outreach & Service for us to discontinue hosting families at our church but to continue as a "supporting congregation." This means providing monetary support, taking part in the clothing drives, providing school clothing for the children in the After Care program through our "Underneath It All" drives, and providing Christmas gifts from the gift cards on our "Giving Tree." Our monetary support helps with maintaining the day center and services for clients, including providing bus passes and gas cards. Since we are no longer hosting, our monetary support is even more important now. Please give generously to support the important service Family Promise provides to homeless families in our city.
