#### Ways to help the Afghan Crisis

**A Local Partner Looking for Refugee Support:** As the war in Afghanistan ends, Exodus Refugee is expecting to assist in settling some Afghani refugees here in the Indianapolis area. Donations are greatly appreciated and a list of needs can be found at <a href="In-kind Support">In-kind Support</a> | Exodus Refugee. Families are arriving with very little notice, so watch the weekly Epistle for more information about how our church can be a part of this vital effort to care for our neighbors.

Church World Service: Church World Service, another agency working in partnership with the U.S. government to resettle refugees, has welcomed more than 7,000 Afghan Special Immigrant Visa recipients and their families since 2009, according to its website. CWS has issued an emergency appeal to support Afghans now arriving in the U.S., asking for \$700,000 in financial support to offer transportation, food and other emergency support and up to \$450,000 in in-kind housing support. Monetary donations can be made onlineor mailed to Church World Service, P.O. Box 968, Elkhart, IN 46515 (designated to Protect Our Afghan Allies). Those interested in sponsoring a family arriving in their community or providing in-kind support — including landlords able to rent housing to new arrivals — can fill out a form online or email refugeewelcome@cwsglobal.org. CWS has also compiled sample messages urging lawmakers to protect Afghans seeking safety on its website that can be shared on social media or sent to lawmakers. #### **Today's Scripture**

#### Mark 9:30-37

They left that district and began a journey through Galilee, but Jesus did not want anyone to know about it. He was teaching the disciples along these lines: "The Promised One is going to be delivered into the hands of others and will be put to death, but three days later this One will rise again." Though they failed to understand these words, they were afraid to question him.

They returned home to Capernaum. Once they were inside the house, Jesus began to ask them, "What were you discussing on the way home?" At this they fell silent, for on the way they had been arguing about who among them was the most important. So Jesus sat down and called the Twelve over and said, "If any of you wants to be first, you must be the last one of all and at the service of all."
