Today's Scriptures

Philippians 1:1-11 (Common English Bible):

¹ From Paul and Timothy, who serve Christ Jesus. To all those in Philippi who are God's people in Christ Jesus, along with your supervisors and servants, ² May the grace and peace from God and Jesus Christ be with you.³ I thank my God every time I mention you in my prayers.⁴ I'm thankful for all of you every time I pray, and it's always a prayer full of joy.⁵ I'm glad because of the way you have been my partners in the ministry of the gospel from the time you first believed it until now. ⁶ I'm sure about this: the one who started a good work in you will stay with you to complete the job by the day of Christ Jesus. ⁷I have good reason to think this way about all of you because I keep you in my heart. You are all my partners in God's grace, both during my time in prison and in the defense and support of the gospel. ⁸ God is my witness that I feel affection for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus.⁹ This is my prayer: that your love might become even more and more rich with knowledge and all kinds of insight. ¹⁰ I pray this so that you will be able to decide what really matters and so you will be sincere and blameless on the day of Christ. ¹¹ I pray that you will then be filled with the fruit of righteousness, which comes from Jesus Christ, in order to give glory and praise to God.

Matthew 5:1-16 (Inclusive Bible):

¹ When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on the mountainside, and after he sat down and the disciples had gathered around, ² Jesus began to teach them: ³ "Blessed are those who are poor in spirit: the kindom of heaven is theirs.⁴ Blessed are those who are mourning: they will be consoled.⁵ Blessed are those who are gentle: they will inherit the land.⁶ Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice: they will have their fill.⁷ Blessed are those who show mercy to others: they will be shown mercy.⁸ Blessed are those whose hearts are clean: they will see God. ⁹ Blessed are those who work for peace: they will be called children of God. ¹⁰ Blessed are those who are persecuted because of their struggle for justice: the kindom of heaven is theirs. ¹¹ "You are fortunate when others insult you and persecute you, and utter every kind of slander against you because of me. ¹² Be glad and rejoice, for your reward in heaven is great; they persecuted the prophets before you in the very same way.¹³ "You are the salt of the earth. But what if salt were to lose its flavor? How could you restore it? It would be fit for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. ¹⁴ "You are the light of the world. You don't build a city on a hill, then try to hide it, do you? ¹⁵ You don't light a lamp, then put it under a bushel basket, do you? No, you set it on a stand where it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, your light must shine before others so that they may see your good acts and give praise to your God in heaven.
