Today's Scripture

Mark 9:14-29

¹⁴ The disciples of John the Baptizer came to Jesus and said, "Why is it that while we and the Pharisees fast, your disciples don't?" ¹⁵ Jesus replied, "How can the guests at a wedding feast mourn while they are still all together? The time will come when the guests will be left alone; then they will fast. 16 "No one sews a piece of unshrunken cloth onto an old cloak, because the patch will pull away from the cloak and the tear will get worse. ¹⁷ Nor do people put new wine into old wineskins—if they do, the skins will burst, the wine will run out, and the skins will be ruined. No, they put new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved." ¹⁸ As Jesus was speaking, a synagogue official came up, knelt down and said, "My daughter has just died. But if you come and lay hands on her, she will live." ¹⁹ Jesus got up and went with the official, and so did the disciples. ²⁰ As they were going along, a woman who had suffered from hemorrhages for twelve years came up behind him and touched the hem of his cloak; ²¹ she was saying to herself, "If only I can touch his cloak, I will be healed." ²² Jesus turned around and saw her. "Courage, daughter," he said, "your faith has healed you." That very moment the woman was healed. 23 When Jesus arrived at the house of the synagogue official, a noisy crowd had gathered, and the flute players who served as mourners had already arrived. ²⁴ When he saw them he said, "Get out! The child is not dead—only asleep." They all laughed at him. ²⁵ After the crowd had been put out, he entered and took the girl by the hand, and she got up. ²⁶ And the news spread throughout the countryside. ²⁷ As Jesus moved on from Capernaum, two blind people followed and cried out, "Heir to the House of David, have pity on us!" ²⁸ When Jesus reached his lodgings, they caught up with him. Jesus said to them, "Do you believe I can do this?" They said, "Yes, Rabbi." ²⁹ Then he touched their eves and said, "Because of your faith, it will be done to you."
