This year marks my 4th anniversary serving as the senior pastor of First Congregational! Our time together has been filled with joy, challenges, growth, learning, changes, healing, hope, and more. Most of all, this time with you in ministry is one of blessing and I hope you all feel the same. Included in our call agreement is the mutual gift of a three month sabbatical upon my fifth year of ministry. I am tentatively planning my sabbatical for July, August, and September of 2023.


The church council has blessed the preparation of a sabbatical renewal grant application to provide funding to the church for our sabbatical activities. I am inviting members and friends of the congregation to participate in feedback for the sabbatical grant application. There will be two open session to discuss the sabbatical proposal and I encourage you to join us. Your input is important. The first one will be Sunday, April 3 at 1:00pm on the church zoom. The second one will be Tuesday, April 12 at 6:30pm on the church zoom.

This is our opportunity as a church to dream together about this time of renewal. My sabbatical theme is "Joy to the World" and I plan to focus on themes of (1) heaven and nature sing, (2) repeat the sounding joy, and (3) the wonders of God's love. While I am experiencing renewal based on these themes, the key question for our church is what will your renewal time look like? In addition to having a sabbatical pastor for three months, how else will you engage this theme of "Joy to the World"?

The application is due April 27, so please attend one of our feedback sessions or share your thoughts with me or one of our senior councilors. Thank you in advance for your support of this time of sabbatical for rest and renewal.

Senior Councilor's Report

Reactivating the FCC Security Committee

Some two and a half years ago, just prior to the onset of the pandemic, a brief discussion took place in our congregation about forming a new committee to deal with matters of church security. Several of us were interested in this issue, and we met briefly to consider various concerns that ought to be addressed. We decided "security" really ought to incorporate emergencies and threats of all kinds, including tornadoes, floods, and other severe weather events; fires; power failures; medical emergencies; bomb threats; unwanted visitor or active shooter situations (God forbid), and more. While we did map out some basic guidelines, the body of our work was placed on hold until now.

Currently, Bill Gillette, Chris Shank, and I comprise the membership of the Security Committee. We are eager to have two or three other church members join us in this enterprise! We are fortunate to have received detailed procedural instructions not only from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Department of Homeland Security, but also locally from Dennis Norris, Head of Security at Second Presbyterian Church, and the Reverend Greg Denk, Disaster Coordinator for the Indiana-Kentucky UCC Conference. Really, much of the preparatory work has already been done for us. Mainly we need to assess the specific needs of our church; review the excellent materials and guidelines we have collected; establish our goals; and effectively communicate the procedures to follow in the event of each potential emergency.

While no one likes to think of having to respond to urgent circumstances such as those enumerated above, being equipped with the knowledge of how best to handle them will help to reduce anxiety and mitigate – if not completely prevent – any unhappy outcomes. Please feel free to contact one of us on the committee if you have thoughts, questions, or suggestions to offer, and do consider joining the committee as we move forward in this important endeavor on behalf of the church we all love.



Mental Health Team Outreach and Service Board



New Partnership with the IKC's Disaster Preparedness and Response Ministry Team –

The Disaster Preparedness and Response Ministry Team (DPRMT) of the IN-KY Conference works to assist with relief from natural disasters, along with a variety of other tasks. As part of their ministry, they put together work camps, including one that was held in March in western KY to help with communities devastated by tornadoes in December 2021.

Over the years, they have accumulated a lot of materials and supplies for their work, and needed a place to store them. Recently, our Trustees have agreed to accommodate the DPRMT's storage needs in our building. They will be using the room at the bottom of the north stairwell by the Mayflower Room, as well as the northwest corner of the kitchen. These are areas that our church has not been using for any particular purpose, so we are glad to put them to meaningful use.

Highlights:

- **Income** of \$46,200 was \$16,800 below budget. However, note we had budgeted a need for \$20,000 in funds from the FCC Foundation but we only needed \$10,000. So the real shortfall was \$6,800.
- **Expenses** of \$48,600 were \$2,000 below budget.

This Spring, as we celebrate the season of Resurrection, we have an opportunity to unburden ourselves of shame and affirm our sacred worth. At our **Shameless Storytelling** retreat, we will use writing as a tool to unpack and let go of the shame we carry.

Shameless Storytelling is a writing workshop. If you come, you will be expected to write. But here are some important things to know:

- ◆ You are not expected to be a "good" writer (whatever that is!). Some of us have shame about our ability to write. But here's the thing: all of us who know how to put words on paper are writers, and all of us have a story to tell. This workshop isn't about being – or becoming – a polished writer. It's about claiming our stories honestly and expressively... and using words to do it.
- ◆ You are not expected to share your story. The writing you do in this workshop will be for you. We will talk about the benefit and risk of sharing our stories, and we will make some space for those who wish to take that step. But the focus of the workshop will be on writing our stories for ourselves, and no one is expected to share their written work during the retreat.

• Shame is an emotionally difficult subject, so come prepared to do some deep personal work at this retreat. But we will also make time to play with our stories, so come open to discovering joy in the process!
