Epistle for the Week of July 21

Dear Church,

As we navigate together what it means to live into providing hybrid (in person and online) worship, we are learning and experimenting as we go. Thank you to our hard working staff for their flexibility and creativity. Thanks to our members for your grace and patience.

One of our guiding values in providing hybrid worship, in addition to meaningful worship, is safety and harm prevention. In addition to creating a safe environment in accordance to the Center for Disease Control during a continued pandemic, we are also seeking to follow best practice for safety of holistic well-being for all. This means being mindful of live-streaming onto the public platform of YouTube activities (both spoken and unspoken) in the sanctuary. We are mindful that we have members who request privacy for safety reasons and do not want to be on video. We also have members who share during joys and concerns confidential information, for example: first and last names and medical conditions. These things are shared out of a desire to love, care, and support one another.

Our staff, our Church Council, our Come Back Team, our Worship and Design Team, and Worship and Faith Board have all discussed how to best provide safety and well-being for hybrid worship. The opportunity is to honor both the desire to provide time for sharing joys and concerns in worship while at the same time honoring the privacy and safety needs of our members. One way to honor both is to invite members to share joys and concerns from the pew without using a microphone. While at first we did not pass the microphone in order to reduce risk of spreading the virus, this also was done to honor the privacy of not being on video. While the risk for spreading the virus on surfaces is less, the privacy concerns

microphone among the congregation for joys and concerns at this time in order to honor the confidentiality and privacy of members because the service is being live-streamed onto YouTube.

While this change from the way we used to do things before the pandemic is challenging for some members, the church leaders entrusted with oversight of worship are prayerful and hopeful that we can respect the needs for safety and privacy of members. This is an experiment and other ways of meeting our needs for sharing joys and concerns are being explored.

Thank you for your support during this time of change as we seek to care for one another, honor each other, and find meaningful ways to connect and share God's love.
