

Today's Scriptures

Philippians 4:1-9

For these reasons, my sisters and brothers—you whom I so love and long for, you who are my joy and my crown—continue, my dear ones, to stand firm in Christ Jesus. I implore Euodia and Syntyche to come to an agreement with each other in Christ. And I ask you, Syzygus, to be a true comrade and help these coworkers. These two women struggled at my side in defending the Good News, along with Clement and the others who worked with me. Their names are written in the Book of Life. Rejoice in the Savior always! I say it again: Rejoice! Let everyone see your forbearing spirit. Our Savior is near. Dismiss all anxiety from your minds; instead, present your needs to God through prayer and petition, giving thanks for all circumstances. Then God's own peace, which is beyond all understanding, will stand guard over your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, my sisters and brothers, your thoughts should be wholly directed to all that is true, all that deserves respect, all that is honest, pure, decent, admirable, virtuous or worthy of praise. Live according to what you have learned and accepted, what you have heard me say and seen me do. Then will the God of peace be with you.

Isaiah 25:1-9

YHWH, you are my God-I exalt you! I praise your Name! For you do marvelous things, planned long ago with steadfast faithfulness. You turned cities into dump heaps, fortified cities into rubble; strongholds of foreigners are no more, never to be rebuilt. It is for this reason that the powerful honor you, and cities of ruthless people fear you. Yet you are a refuge to poor people refuge to the needy in their distress, shelter in the storm. shade from the heat for the breath of the ruthless is like an ice storm or a scorching drought. You subdue the roar of the enemy, and the mantra of tyrants is stilled. On this mountain, YHWH Omnipotent will prepare for all peoples a banquet of rich food, a banquet of fine wines, food rich and succulent, and fine, aged wines. On this mountain God will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples, the shroud covering all nations, destroying all death forever. God will wipe away the tears from every cheek, and will take away the shame of God's people on earth, wherever they live. YHWH has spoken. On that Day it will be said, "This is our God, this is the One for whose liberation we waited,

YHWH is the One in whom we had hoped! We rejoice exultantly in our deliverance.
