Constitution and Bylaws Update

Special Congregational Meeting to Vote on the Constitution & Bylaws Proposal

- As announced on November 10, there will be a special congregational meeting on Sunday, December 10. It will start with a pitch-in lunch following worship, and our meeting will begin at 12:45. The purpose of the meeting is to vote on a new Constitution and Bylaws for our church. Our current Constitution requires notice of proposed changes at least one month prior to the vote, and the changes require approval by a three-fourths vote of those present and voting. Per the Constitution, this will be the only business item discussed at this meeting.

During the past several years, our congregation has voted to suspend certain parts of the Constitution and Bylaws at our Annual Meetings. The "CBL Team" was created this year to update this document. It consisted of Wendy Baldwin, Steve Coomer, Steve Leatherman, and Pastor Sarah; Judy Fletcher also served on the team until July. This group met regularly since March



to put together a proposed revision of the current Constitution and Bylaws. There were several opportunities in October and November to discuss this proposal with members. A lot of input was given, most of which has been incorporated into this final proposal.

We hope you can attend the congregational meeting. A summary of the changes, along with the final proposal, is available in the Narthex, or can be accessed in the weekly e-pistles. If you have any comments or questions about the proposal, please contact the CBL Team.

OUTREACH & SERVICE Mental Health Team Outreach and Service Board

The Outreach and Service Board plan several opportunities for service and giving in December. We will have our traditional mitten tree. Beginning November 26th, contribute mittens, gloves, hats, scarves, and socks (childs and adult) which will be delivered to Exodus Refugee. We have refugee families coming to our community who have never experienced our Indiana Winters. Our giving tree will also be up in the parlor. Gift cards from big box stores for the amount of \$25.00 will be accepted beginning November 26th. The gift cards will be sent to Family Promise and Indiana Youth Group to provide additional Christmas funds for those families and individuals who may have very limited funds. We have to begin

before Advent due to our limitations of when these groups need to distribute these gifts. Boxes will be available in the narthex until the tree goes up. Gift cards can be put in the offering plate until the tree appears and will be added to the tree at that time.

The last of our UCC 5 for 5 offerings will be December 17th. This offering in the UCC Christmas Fund. These funds supports our retired clergy and their widows. Many of our clergy have served small parishes and have limited or no pensions other than their social security. This fund offers of cash for Christmas or cash gifts to cover emergencies like major damage to home in storms, or medical emergencies.

This gathering is open to everyone and is an informal time to check-in about how you are doing, get emotional support from church family, and offer prayer for one another as we navigate nurturing positive mental health in these difficult days. We are an open group with confidentiality guidelines. Sessions are on Zoom.

JUST PEACE COVENANT GIVING: The Outreach and Service Board is encouraging members to financially support community organizations that align with our churches' just peace covenant.

PEACE LEARNING CENTER (PLC): The PLC was created in 1997 by a team of people that included Tim Nation, the PLC's current Executive Director, to reduce violence and increase kindness in our community. It is housed at Eagle Creek Park and has reached more than 250,000 people locally and internationally. It all started with a few people concerned about neighborhood and family violence in Indianapolis. The PLC works directly with schools, community nonprofits, businesses, juvenile correctional facilities, and faith groups to facilitate peace education. The PLC's programs are designed to teach safe and simple ways to manage anger, solve problems, and develop appreciation for differing perspectives. They believe everyone can be a peacemaker. The PLC's mission is to facilitate community learning that acts as a catalyst for peace, equity, and justice and its vision is a healed world where strong and caring communities strive together to fully live in peace.

FCC member Worth Hartman, a founding board member of the PLC, was on had to celebrate the PLC's 25th anniversary. Founder and director Tim Nation spoke at that occasion and explained the Peace Learning Center's advocacy for restorative disciplinary actions in schools is built on "love and respect" rather than "fear and intimidation." "What we've been trying to do is work directly with young people to teach them how to have healthy relationships. And how to deal with conflicts and differences,"

FAITH IN INDIANA: Since 2021 our Just Peace commitment has focused on supporting Faith in Indiana. Faith in Indiana (FII) is a vehicle for congregations, clergy, and people of faith to act collectively for racial and economic justice in Indiana. FII believes every Indiana resident deserves to live in a safe, healthy, and supportive community and that no one should be left out. We are a part of FII's Indy Metro Congregational Coalition and have a dedicated organizer, Bailey Schwartz. As a church we have supported FII in the following ways:

- We sponsored a Research Action Meeting with a state senator. 34 people participated in the meeting as we introduced FII's principles and agenda and presented our concerns on the issues of gun violence, COVID relief and ID for immigrants.
- Members participated in a meeting with Indianapolis officials urging Indianapolis to create a municipal ID for undocumented residents.
- FCC representatives attended FII's "Building the Base/Faith Voices Campaign"
- We hosted four house meetings where participants were invited to share personal stories of someone who is hurting in your life, how does this relate to your own faith and values and how current government policies affect people's suffering. 24 distinct individuals attended the various meetings.
- Made phone calls urging citizen's to vote
- Members attended "A Rally for Care" asking legislators to fully fund SB #1 creating a system of mental health crisis response with a phone number to call, a mobile response team to respond and a crisis stabilization facility to provide ongoing care. Pastor Sarah was a featured speaker. Through FII's efforts SB #1 was passed with a historic \$150 million commitment to crisis mental health services.
- Attended "Listening Campaign" to discern 2024's organizing campaigns on the issues most important to the Indy Metro Congregational Coalition

TRUSTEES

Fundraising and Other Updates from your Building Manager

Thank you to those who have contributed to our Capital Improvements campaign! In the past months, about \$35,000 was raised to supplement existing funding. This allowed us to make some much-needed repairs to our building and grounds. These gifts came in all sizes, but it all adds up; we could not have done the work we did without these donations. Your continued support is greatly appreciated, since there is more work to do! Gifts to "Capital Improvements" help us to provide a safe and comfortable setting for our worship and ministries. Thank you!

Here is a summary of projects that have been completed in the last few months:

- The new boiler system is now up and running. This cost \$138,000.
- Work on the steeple has been completed, for now. There was a lot of wood rot, and new copper flashing was installed. This cost over \$15,000. Additional wood rot was identified, and we have decided to hold off on this work until June 2024; it will also cost about \$15,000.
- The parking lot and driveway were crack sealed, sealed, and "striped" in October, at a cost of \$9800. This work protects the \$35,000 investment we made in 2015 when it was fully repayed.

Another concern is the water that periodically comes in through the Boiler Room during heavy downpours. Due to the slope of the floor, the water then runs into the hallway, and needs to be mopped up. We discovered that there is a foundation problem, and have contracted with Indiana Foundation Solutions to do the repair work in January, by adding piers, installing a basement 'gutter', new drain, and new sump pump in the boiler room. This will cost \$15,000, but should secure our building foundation for many years to come.

The next project that we would like to do – pending funding – is to replace and improve the accessibility of the "patio door", used as our main entrance. We also have a quote to improve the Wifi accessibility throughout the building, which will cost about \$8000.

Thank you again for contributions of any size - Together we can secure and improve the building which houses our many wonderful ministries!

Highlights:

- **Income** of \$238,700 was \$31,200 above budget, due primarily to timing of Foundation draws. Excluding those, income was still better than budget, but only by \$3,200.
- **Expenses** of \$237,200 were \$7,900 over budget due to House & Grounds (\$8,600 bldg. maintenance and nat. gas), Admin (\$1,100 IT and copying), and Worship and Faith (\$1,000 vocalists, organ and piano maintenance, supply pastors).
- Cash at October 31 was \$52,700.
- Looking ahead: Cash will be tight for the end of 2023. We continue to run a large operating deficit, with \$238,700 of expenses versus \$154,600 of "new money" through October. We are very fortunate to be able to close this gap with funds from the FCC Foundation, but we cannot continue to draw from the Foundation at the current pace indefinitely. And we still have some large cash outlays before year-end, including the final boiler

payment (\$27,500), paving (\$9,800), and mission giving (+\$3,000) that will strain our year-end cash balances. All year-end gifts will be greatly appreciated!
