What Is Access Sunday?

Access Sunday is an annual celebration of the gifts persons with disabilities bring to the church, and the joys of being in accessible community. It is also a time to remember and repent of the harm done to disabled people in religious spaces, and to call upon the whole church to recommit itself to access as a justice issue. In the UCC calendar, the second Sunday in October is designated as Access Sunday, but any Sunday of the year is a good time to consider disability and accessibility. Approximately 1 in 4 people in the United States live with some form of disability, and almost everyone else will develop one at some point in their life. TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

John 9:1-7

As Jesus walked along, he saw someone who had been blind from birth. The disciples asked Jesus, "Rabbi, was it this individual's sin that caused the blindness, or that of the parents?" "Neither," answered Jesus, "It wasn't because of anyone's sin—not this person's, nor the parents'. Rather, it was to let God's works shine forth in this person. We must do the deeds of the One who sent me while it is still day—for night is coming, when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." With that, Jesus spat on the ground, made mud with his saliva and smeared the blind one's eyes with the mud. Then Jesus said, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam"—"Siloam" means "sent." So the person went off to wash, and came back able to see.
