TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

Luke 6:17-26

Coming down the mountain with them, Jesus stopped in a level area where there were a great number of disciples. A

large crowd of people was with them from Jerusalem and all over Judea, to as far north as the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon—people who had come to hear Jesus and be healed of their diseases, and even to be freed from unclean spirits. Indeed, the whole crowd was trying to touch Jesus, because power was coming out of him and healing them all. Looking at the disciples, Jesus said:

"You who are poor are blessed,

for the reign of God is yours.

You who hunger now are blessed,
