More About Rev. Dr. Malcolm Himschoot

Rev. Dr. Malcolm Himschoot has been in UCC ministry for 22 years, as long as he has identified as a man and claimed a public role in transgender education. With the United Church of Christ in 2004 he helped make the indie documentary *Call Me Malcolm*.

Himschoot's ministry has taken him from streets and prisons near the Denver Inner City Parish, to immigrant vigils, to affordable housing in Minneapolis, to policing reform in Cleveland, to coalition-building for indigenous rights in Maine. Along the way he has served established and new congregations, leading worship, preaching and teaching, offering pastoral care, and doing music with children. He served on denominational staff with Local Church Ministries from 2012-2019. Now in Maine co-pastoring the ecumenical Church of Universal Fellowship, he also directs the Maine Conference UCC program in regional theological education for lay learning and rural leadership development: The Maine School of Ministry.

His new book is <u>Reading Secrets: A Queer Inheritance of Life and Scripture</u>. In poetic form it tells of spirituality and sexuality, a conflicting relationship with his father, and the promise and pathos of sacred text.
