

Exodus 35:4-29

To the gathered Israelites, Moses continued, "Here is what YHWH has commanded: Raise a contribution for YHWH. Whoever is willing and generous is to bring a gift for the Holy One: gold, silver and bronze; indigo, purple and scarlet yarn, and fine linen; goat's hair, tanned sheep's skin, and fine leather; acacia wood; lamp oil; spices for the anointing oil and for the fragrant incense; and onyx stones and other gems to be set in the ephod and the breastpiece. "All the skilled artisans among us are to make what YHWH has commanded: the Tabernacle with its tent and covering, clasps, frames, crossbars, posts and bases; the Ark with its poles, the Covering, and the screen curtain; the table with its poles and all the vessels, and the Bread of the Presence; the lampstand for the light and its accessories—the lamps and the oil for the lampstand; the incense altar with its poles, the anointing oil, the fragrant incense and the hangings for the entryway to the Tabernacle; the altar for burnt offerings, its bronze grating, its poles and its utensils; the bronze basin and its stand; the courtyard with its posts and bases, and the curtain for the courtyard entrance; the pegs for the Tabernacle and for the courtyard and their cords; and the finely-worked vestments for ministering in the sanctuary—both the sacred vestments for Aaron the priest, and the vestments for Aaron's heirs when they serve as priests." All the gathered Israelites left Moses' presence, and those who were inspired in their minds and moved in their spirits returned with freewill offerings to YHWH for the work on the Tent of Meeting, for all its services and for the sacred garments. Women and men alike gave freely, bringing gold jewelry: brooches, earrings, finger rings, bracelets, necklaces, various gold objects every one of them presented a donation to YHWH. Those who had indigo, purple or scarlet yarn, or fine linen or goats' hair, or tanned rams' skins or fine leather, brought it. Those who were able brought silver or bronze as offerings to YHWH, and those who had acacia wood suitable for this work brought it. Skilled women set to spinning with their hands the indigo, purple and scarlet yarn, and the fine linen, and brought it, while other inspired women with practical knowledge spun the goats' hair. The clan leaders brought onyx stones and other gems for mounting on the ephod and the breastpiece, and spices and oil for the lamps, and for the anointing oil and the fragrant incense. Every Israelite, woman or man, whose heart was moved to contribute to this work that YHWH had commanded of Moses, brought items necessary for the work, and did so freely.
