

We celebrate being a Just Peace making, Green for care of Creation, and WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive and Engaged) for mental health church, with an Open and Affirming covenant supporting the LGBTQAAI+ community.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

Isaiah 2:1-4

This is what Isaiah ben-Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem: In the last days, the mountain of YHWH's Temple will be established as the most important mountain and raised above all other hills all nations will stream toward it. Many people will come and say: "Come, let us climb YHWH's mountain to the Temple of the God of Jacob, that we may be instructed in God's ways and walk in God's paths." They will beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation will not raise the sword against another,
